



visit. After I got out of the Air Force, I came running back to the hills of Tennessee just as fast as my 1963 Thunderbird could pull the rental trailer.



<u>Jerry Richard Meyer</u> - I don't look much different, except my hair is rapidly graying and thinning, and the mustache I've had since college is going gray too.




<u>Terry Dale Davenport</u> - Since graduation I have done the following:




We have been blessed with a beautiful granddaughter, Ivy Jade Little. She was born January 9th 2007 to Candace and Chris Little.

During her three years in that position, Elaine played an instrumental role in the development of the careers of major country music artists such as Moe Bandy, Kix Brooks (Brooks & Dunn), and The Judds, among others. In fact, Wynona Judd lived with Elaine and her husband for a year following her graduation from high school.

In 1990, Elaine formed Ganick Communications to provide full-service marketing and communications strategies. The company specializes in corporate video production, communications consulting and training, and provides services in other areas such as broadcast production, writing, advertising, public relations and marketing. 

And last but not least I have to mention my best little friend in the world, my miniature black schnauzer, "Gracie".



John Marvin Young III- 40 years later I still think our class of 67 rocked and was the last great class to come out of Glencliff.



I never married or had children and have decided that should I ever leave the US, I would move to New Zealand. The country is beautiful and the people are so nice.


I still love sports. I love the University of Oklahoma football and have season tickets for Vanderbilt football and basketball. Go Dores!!!





Pets: I have a weenie dog, 3 years old. He is quite an entertainer. His name is TAZ. Everywhere I go he is usually with me.






<u>Pamela Dorn Cunningham (Cone)</u> - Married, Divorced, Married, Divorced, Married, Divorced. That's it...DONE!


If you catch her dreaming of her high school days, she guarantees she'll have a smile when thinking about those away football games, riding on the band bus, or just cheering on the Colts.

My only near claim-to-fame is that my husband's nephew, Stephen Harper, is the current Prime Minister of Canada.



I am married to Martha Hollyday Batts who is from Ashville, NC and we have two children, Chandler (14 year old son) and Kathryn (10 year old daughter).



Hope to finish out work in a few years and maybe do some traveling.






In 2003, I had breast cancer. I underwent chemo and radiation treatments. Since then I am a much happier person knowing that every day is such a blessing just to be alive.






Currently I am an office manager for a local CPA firm and really love it.
