Shooting at Apartment Units Leaves Nashville Man Dead

A Nashville man was shot fatally late Saturday at a Murfreesboro Road apartment complex during an argument which witnesses said began earlier that day at Hermitage Landing, according to police.

Thomas A. Billingsley, 29, a resident of the Castile Apartments, 1199 Murfreesboro Road, was dead on arrival at General Hospital with a single, small-caliber bullet wound to the chest, said Metro Homicide detective Robert Moore.

AUTHORITIES WERE seeking Johnny Moore, of Portland, Tenn., and possibly one or two others for questioning in connection with the shooting, the detective said.

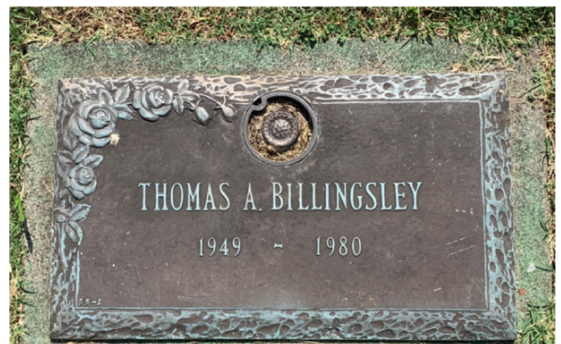
Danny L. Carroll, a friend of the victim who lives at the apartment complex and who witnessed the shooting incident, told investigators he and Billingsley were accosted by

Moore some time after a concert Saturday at the Percy Priest Lake entertainment area.

Carroll told police that the fight started over accusations by Moore that Carroll had "gotten his [Moore's] niece high on drugs." The clash ended with the Portland man threatening to get even, Carroll told police.

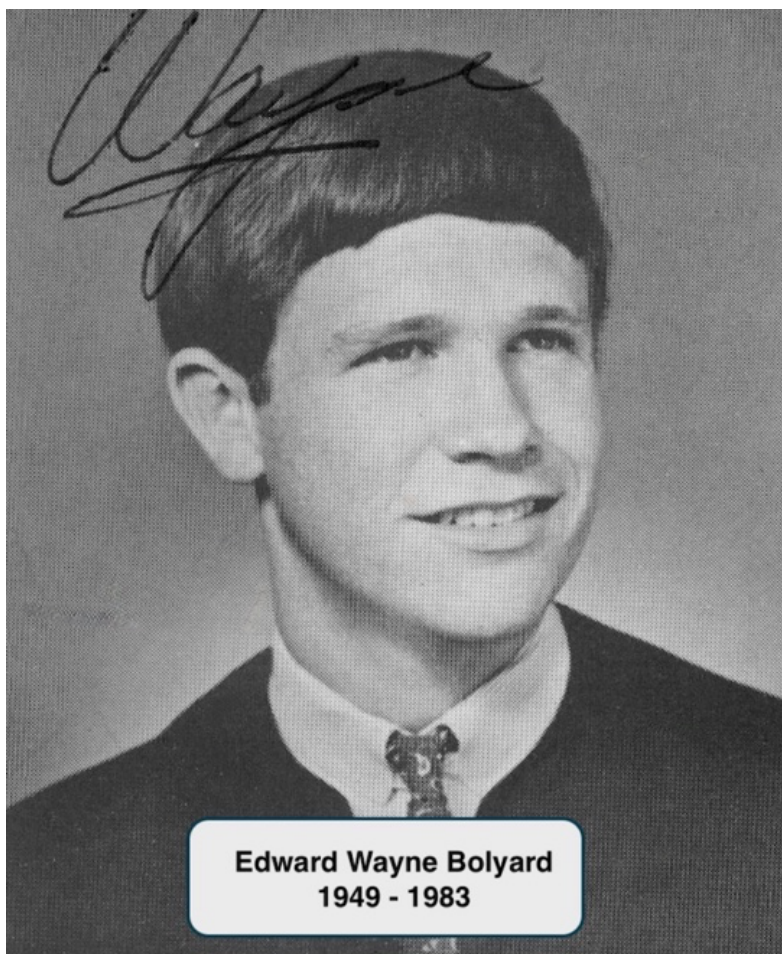
SHORTLY BEFORE midnight, he added, Moore and two other persons drove past his apartment where Billingsley and two women, according to Carroll, were having a get-together.

"Tommy grabbed my gun [a 38-caliber revolver] and met them outside," Carroll said. "Tommy said he didn't want any trouble and then I heard three quick shots and Tommy said he was hit. They took off in their car."

Man Critically Hurt When Truck Hit By Fleeing Pair

A Nashville man was critically injured yesterday when his pickup truck was rammed broadside at Murfreesboro Road and Spence Lane by a car carrying two burglary suspects fleeing police, authorities said.

Fred Conatser, 32, of 2723 Anderson Road, the driver of the truck, suffered massive head injuries in the accident. He was taken to General Hospital, where he was listed in critical condition, police said.

THE DRIVER OF the fleeing auto, Ricky A. Leach, 23, of 1116 Howard Ave., and passenger James A. Swindle, 18, of 5008 Lewisdale Circle, were admitted to General Hospital where they were reported in good condition.

Both have been charged with fleeing and eluding, malicious destruction of property and wreckless driving in connection with the chase and accident.

Additional charges against the two have not been placed pending a police investigation of the burglary allegations, officers said.

Swindle reportedly has been out of jail about one week.

According to Metro traffic Officer Loyd Poteete, patrolmen Ron Bean and J.L. Jones answered a burglary call at the home of Dewey Medley, 1922 Karen Drive, about 7:15 p.m. and saw two men attempting to break into the home.

WHEN THE MEN saw the policemen, they ran to their 1974 Buick Electra and sped off on Patricia Drive. The officers fell in behind the car and were joined in the chase by K-9 officer, Clyde Stephens. Poteete said the chase continued to Thompson Lane, where the suspects turned north and raced to Murfreesboro Road with police right behind.

At Murfreesboro Road, the two men headed west and began to leave the police cars behind, he said.

"The car was much faster than the police vehicles and it was pulling away from them as they approached Spence Lane and a red signal light," Poteete said. "Conatser was southbound on Spence Lane and about to turn left onto Murfreesboro Road when the fleeing auto struck him broadside.

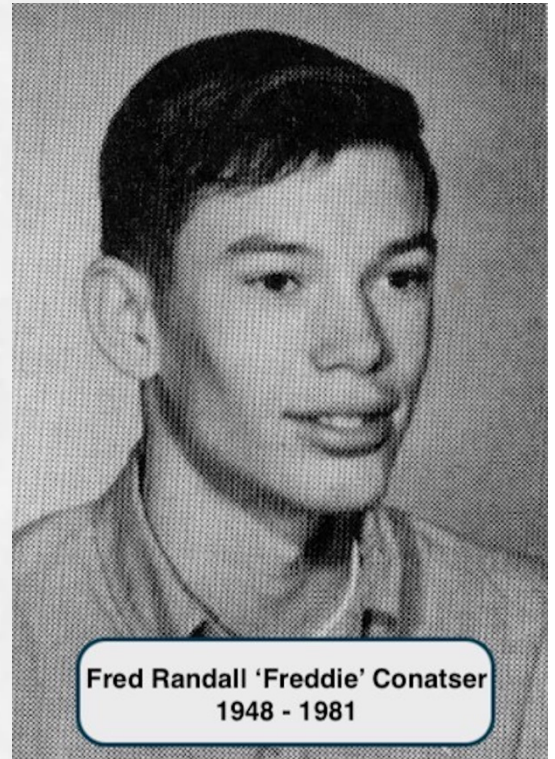
"He was knocked out of control to the opposite side of the street where his truck made contact with an oncoming police car."

POTEETE SAID the driver of the police vehicle, Sgt. Douglas Stephens, attempted to avoid the accident by driving into the median, but was struck by the pickup truck and the Buick, which came to rest on the top of the cruiser's front end.

Stephens was not seriously injured. He was transported to General Hospital for observation and later released.

All three vehicles were demolished in the accident, the officer said.

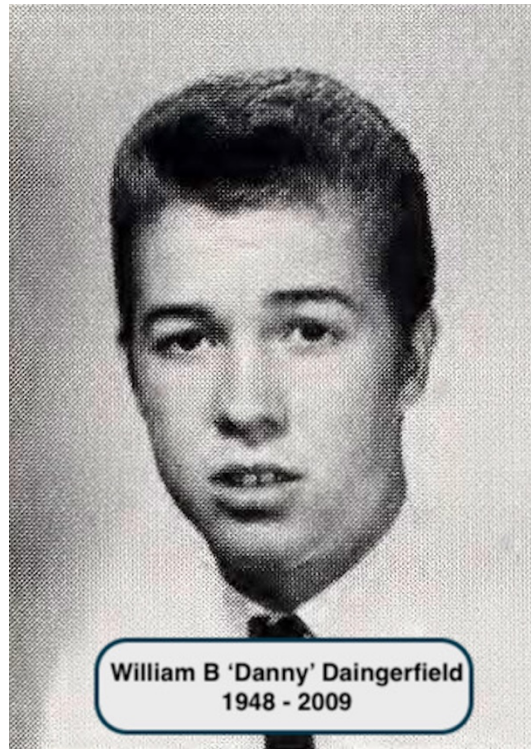

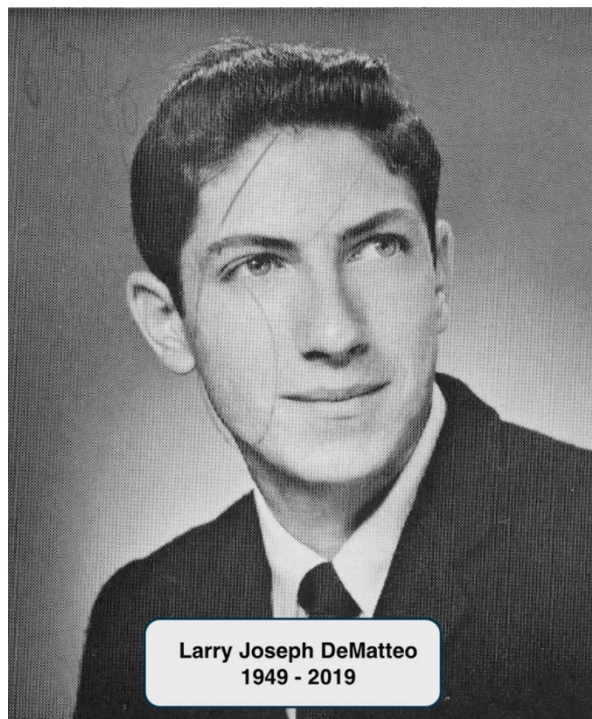

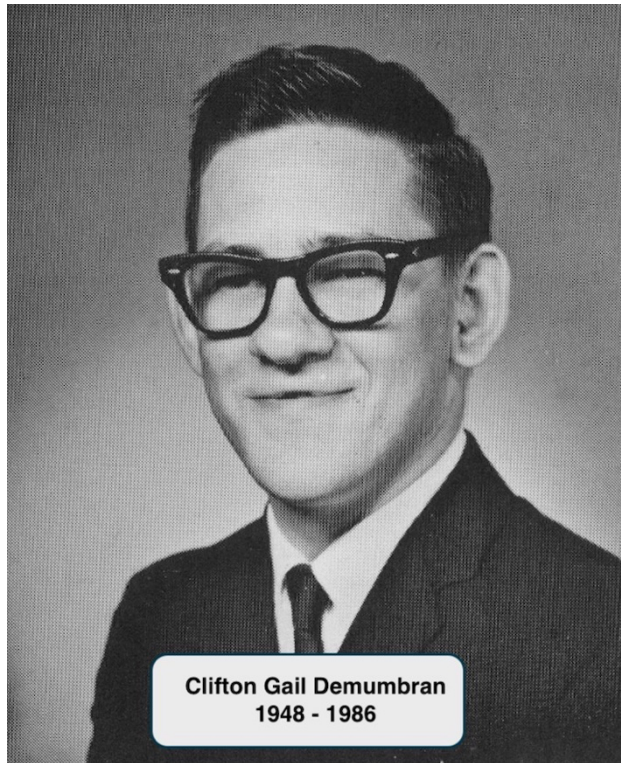
Larry Joseph DeMatteo

Charred ruins probed

Propane gas cylinder linked to Lebanon fire

LEBANON, Tenn. — A liquid propane gas cylinder appears to have caused a fire that killed two employees of a battery manufacturing company here, an investigator said yesterday.

"This is a type of flames that could be caused by LP gas and we have a tank that blew up," said Gary Chappell, an arson division investigator with the state fire marshal's office.

Chappell's comment came after he picked his way through the charred ruins of the Used Repair Shop Inc., an auto and boat battery manufacturing plant.

The Wednesday afternoon explosion and fire killed company employees Martin Sisco, 38, of Lebanon, and Clifton Gail Demumbran, 37, of Nashville, and destroyed the concrete block building recently purchased from the Hester Battery Co.

Two other employees were burned in the 1 p.m. blaze that took 35 Lebanon and Wilson County Civil Defense firefighters an hour to extinguish.

Larry Smith, 39, and Danny Armstead, 25, both of Lebanon, were taken to Vanderbilt Hospital's Burn Unit after they ran from the burning building. Smith remained yesterday in fair condition with burns over 20% of his body, while Armstead was listed in guarded condition last night suffering from burns over 67% of his body.

Chappell declined to positively

identify the LP gas cylinder as the source of the blaze, but said at this point in his investigation he had ruled out any other possible cause.

Chappell said he was told by company officials that the highly volatile liquid propane was used to fuel a torch that melted plastic over new batteries. He noted that employee descriptions of fire on the floor and walls were consistent with a liquid propane fire, since the gas is heavier than air.

Employees who escaped the blaze said they saw flames on the walls and on the floor just moments after an initial explosion. Sisco was working with an acetylene torch about five or six feet away from the propane tank when the explosion occurred, Chappell said.

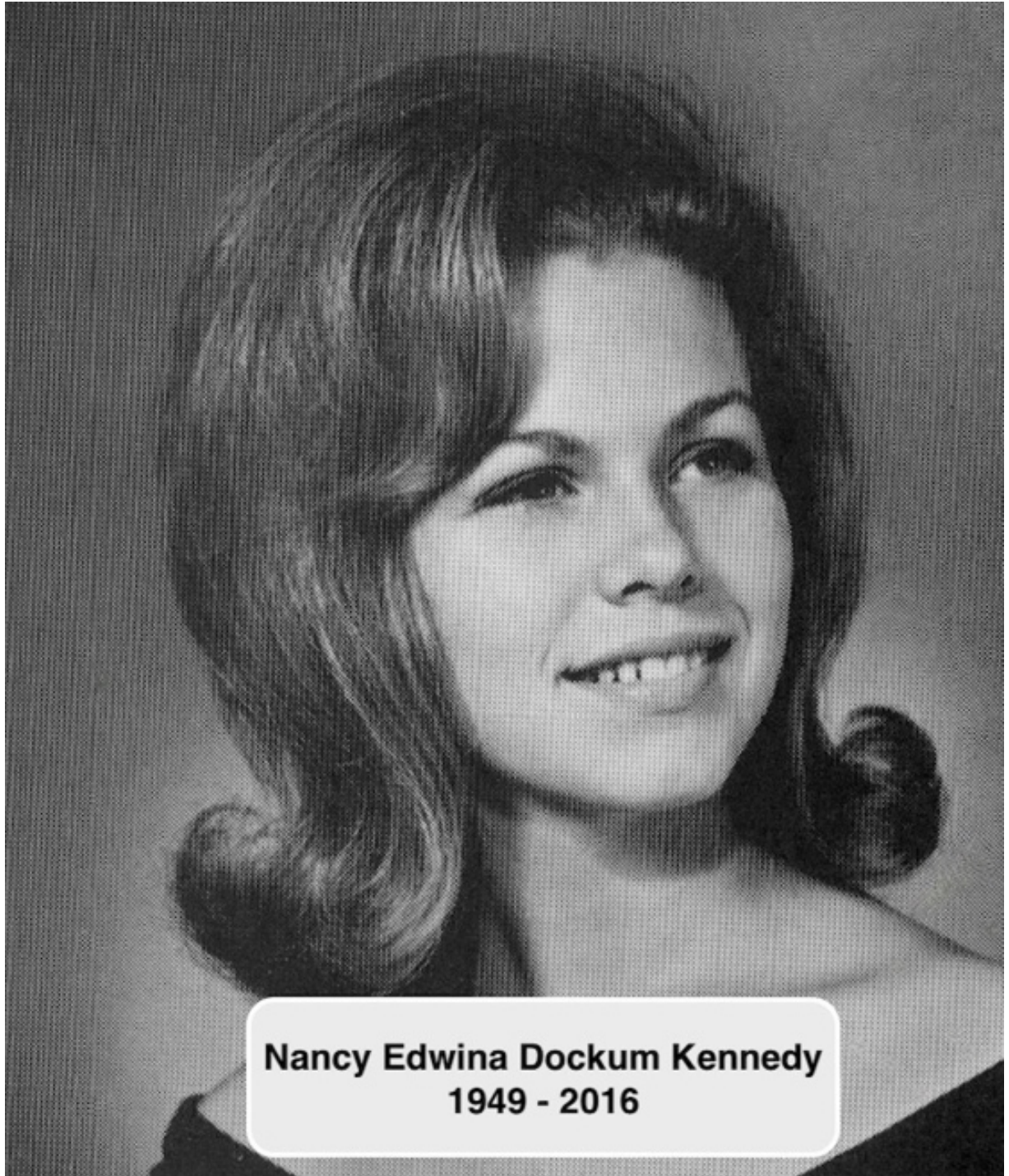
Employee Bobby Harris, whose own fingers were burned "stripping the clothes off" Smith's burning body, said he looked around after the explosion and "saw the whole wall and floor on fire."

The remains of the propane tank will be taken to Tennessee Technological University in Cookeville, where the metal will be tested for any weaknesses that might have caused the tank to rupture, sparking the fire and explosion, Chappell said. A report is expected next week, he added.

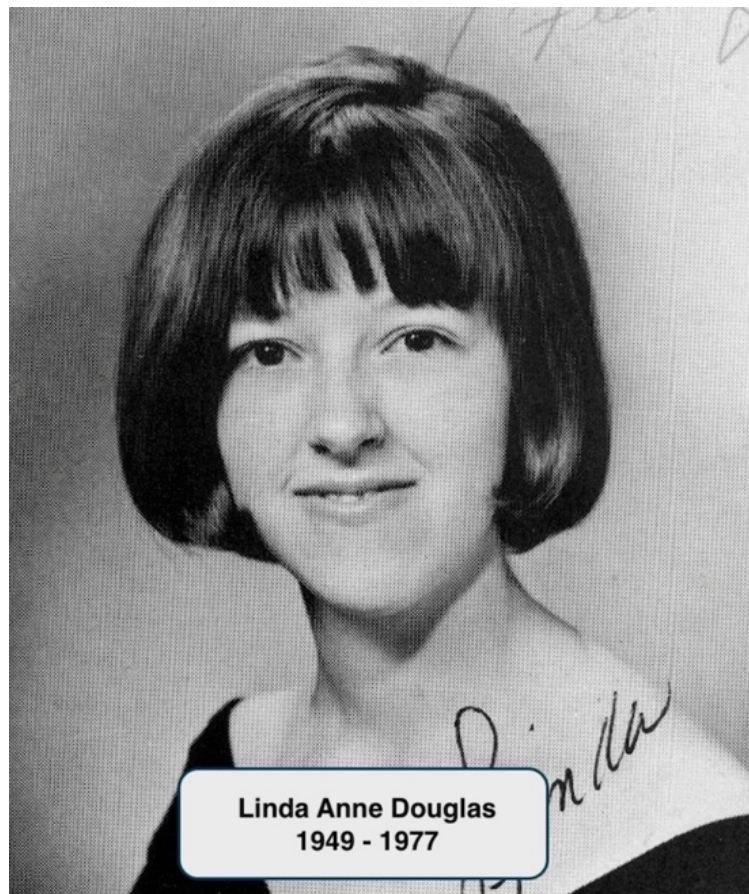

Fire kills woman, injures her brother

Crews arriving at the scene ran inside to bring Frazier and Eubank out, but were unable to save Frazier. She was taken to Southern

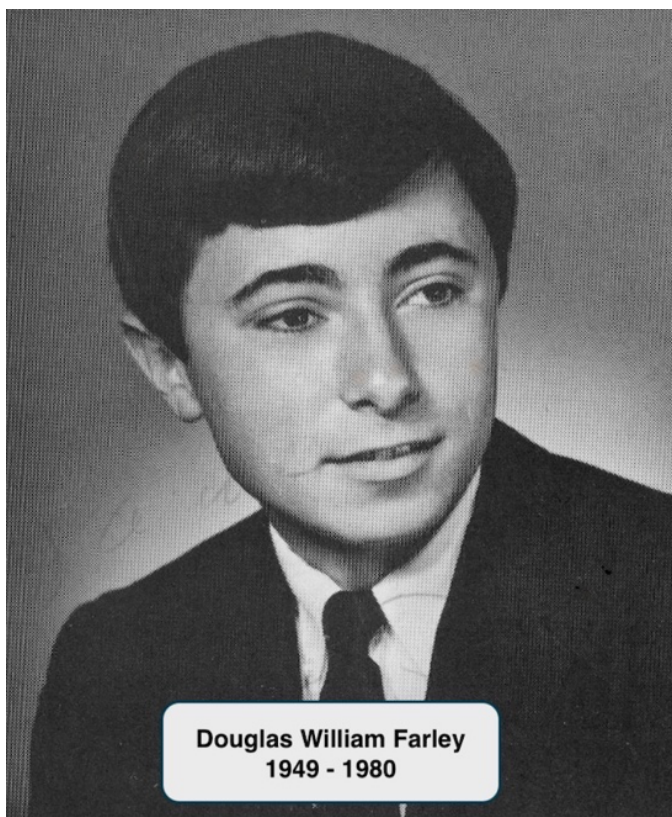
Hills Medical Center where she was pronounced dead.

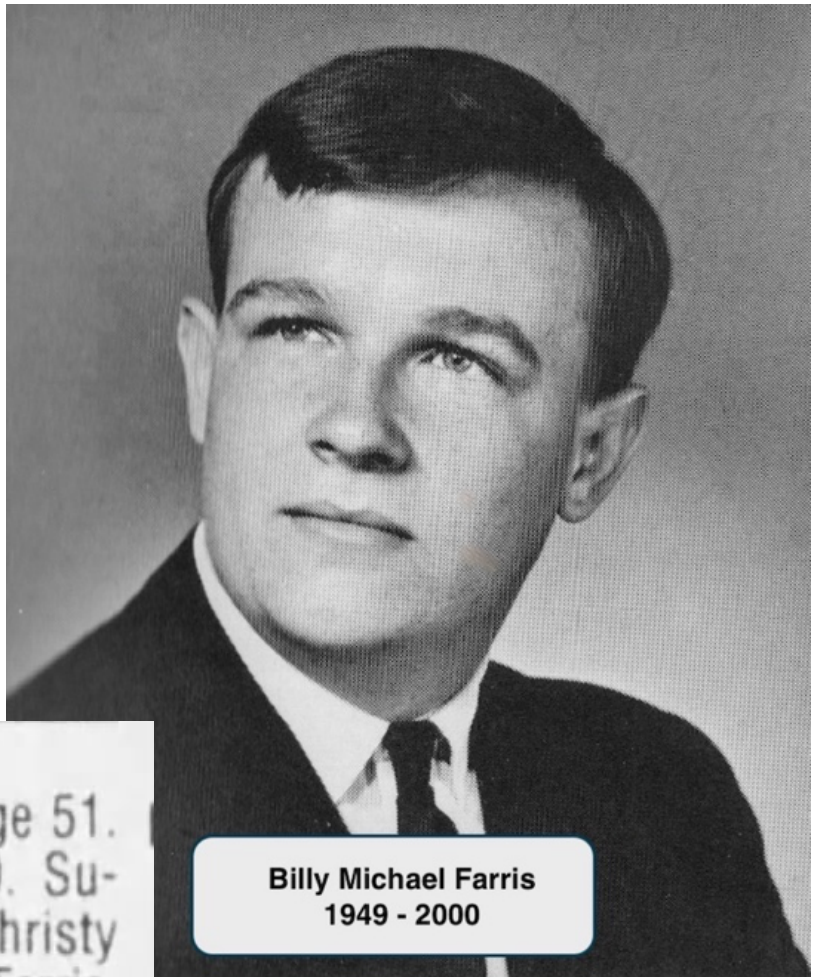

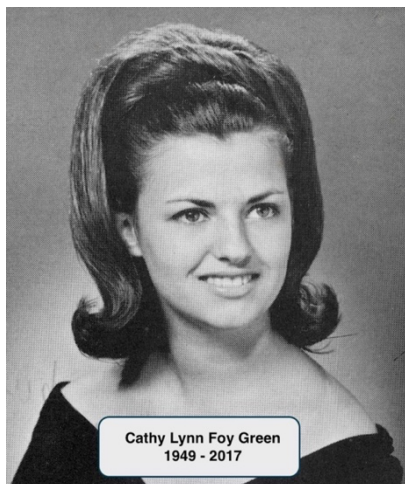

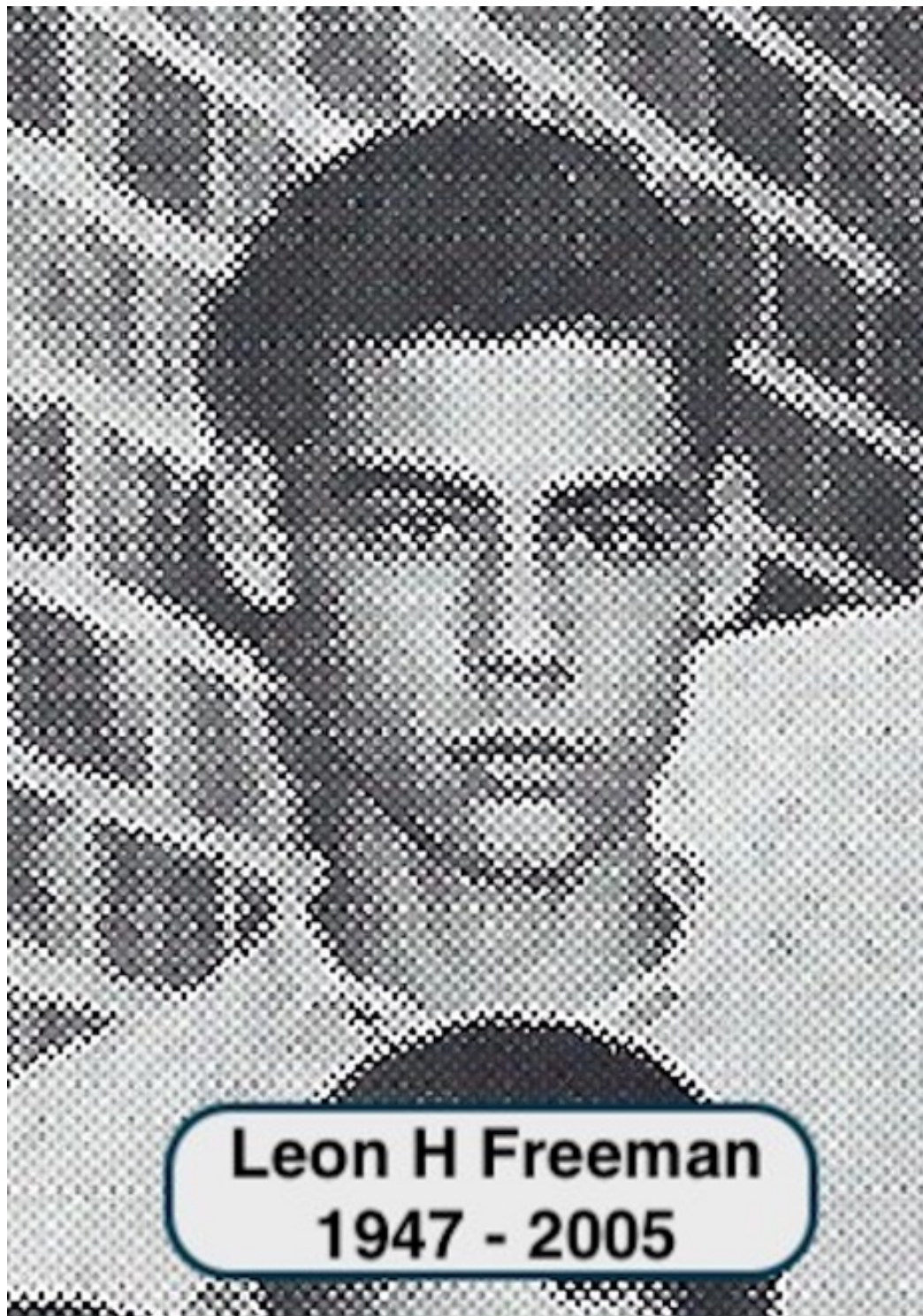

Cathy loved traveling with her husband, and especially loved visiting beautiful beaches.

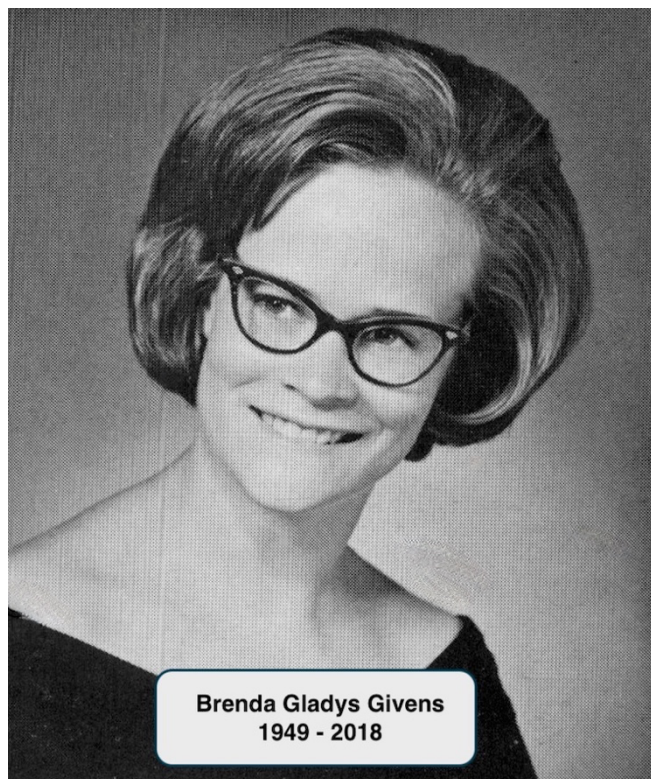
